

# OBTAINING PERSISTENT LINKS TO FULL-TEXT ARTICLES AND CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

## ACM DIGITAL LIBRARY

1. Go to the full citation of the article or proceeding that you are interested in.

2. Replace everything before /citation (that is, everything up to those first four digits 3116) with <https://libaccess.senecacollege.ca/login?url=http://portal.acm.org>

So for the above example:

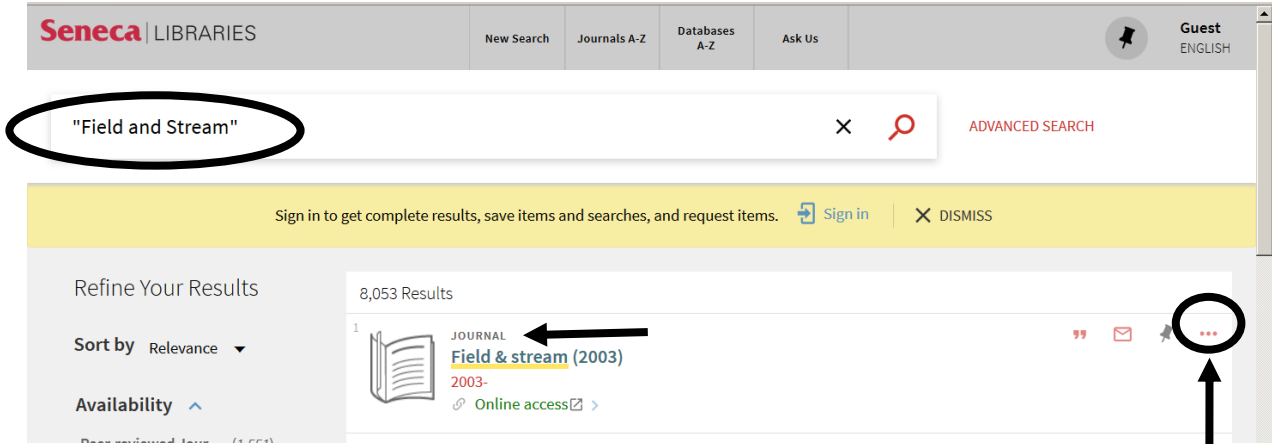
3. Test links before posting via email, course webpages, etc.

# OBTAINING PERSISTENT LINKS TO PERIODICAL TITLES

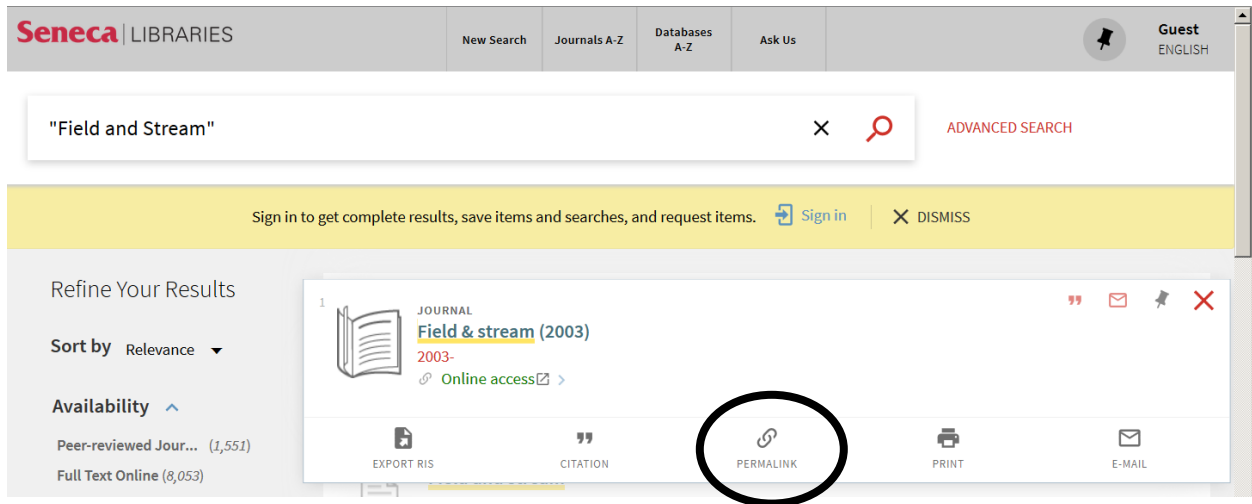
## ALL JOURNAL TITLES

Persistent links to periodical titles (journals, magazines, newspapers, etc.) are available through the search box on the [Seneca Libraries homepage](#). This type of link will allow users to view all of the libraries' holdings for specific titles.

1. Go to the Seneca Libraries homepage at <http://library.senecacollege.ca/> and search for the name of a periodical:



2. Click the three dots over to the right to reveal the following options:

3. Click "PERMALINK" to reveal this:
