


OBTAINING PERSISTENT LINKS TO CURIO.CA VIDEOS

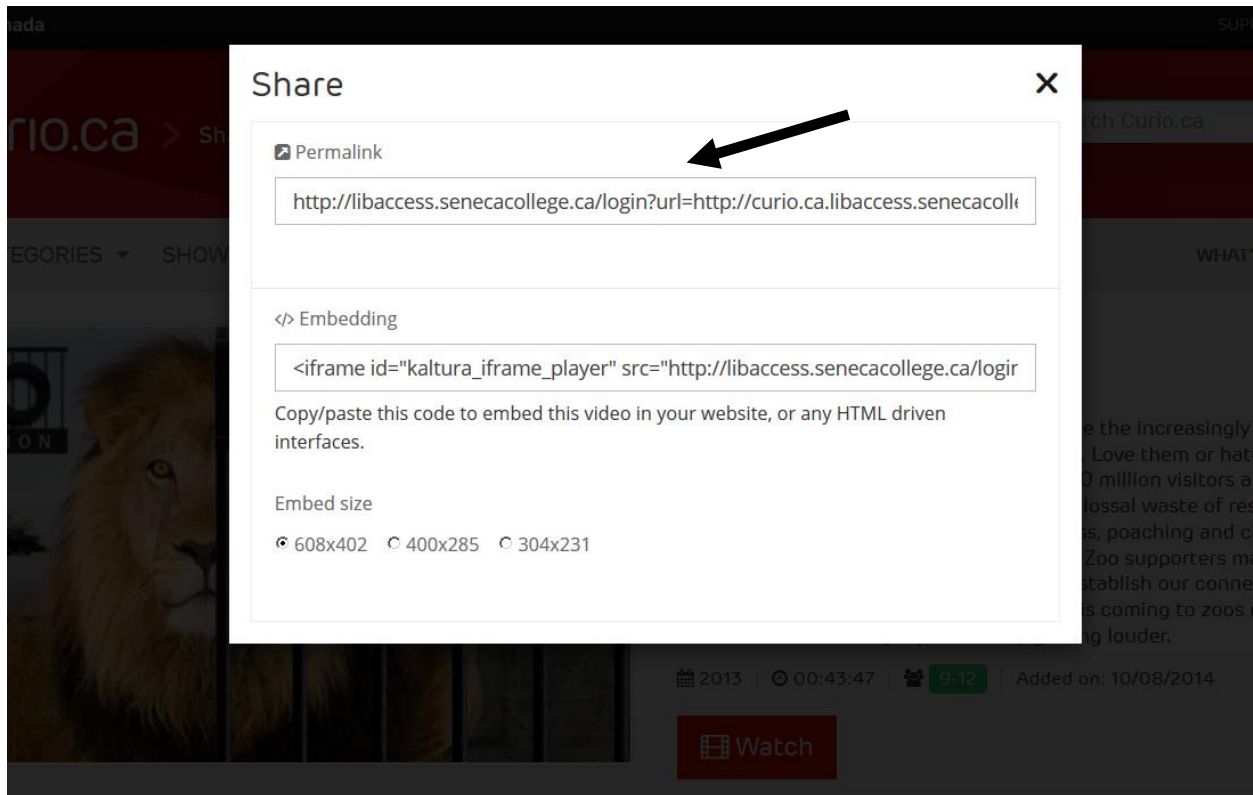

1. Retrieve the video that you are interested in. In the following example we will use the video, “Zoo Revolution”:

3. Copy the URL under “Permalink” ...

... and **replace everything up to /en** with the following ...

“<https://libaccess.senecacollege.ca/login?url=http://curio.ca>”

The resulting compound link ...

<https://libaccess.senecacollege.ca/login?url=http://curio.ca/en/video/zoo-revolution-3243/>

... is a persistent link to this specific video that may be accessed by current students, faculty, and staff, both on- and off-campus, and may be put into MySeneca course pages, etc. Test the link before posting.
