1. Find the article you are interested in.

3. Replace everything up to /entry with...

**["https://libaccess.senecacollege.ca/login?url=http://www.europaworld.com"](https://libaccess.senecacollege.ca/login?url=http://www.europaworld.com)**

The resulting link for the above example would be...

**<https://libaccess.senecacollege.ca/login?url=http://www.europaworld.com/entry/EE01646>**

... and is a persistent link to this article, accessible both on- and off-campus.

4. Test all links before posting via email, to course webpages, etc.
