

# OBTAINING PERSISTENT LINKS TO FULL TEXT ARTICLES

## TAYLOR & FRANCIS

1. Find the article that you are interested in:

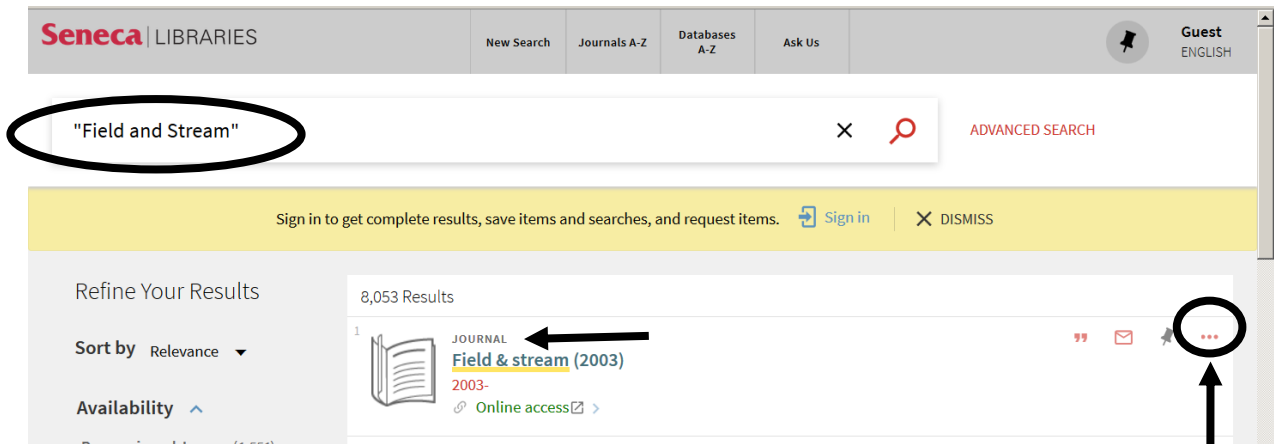
2. Copy the complete DOI into a text editor.
3. Replace everything before the numbers with **<https://libaccess.senecacollege.ca/login?url=http://dx.doi.org/>**  
So for the article above,  
**<https://libaccess.senecacollege.ca/login?url=http://dx.doi.org/10.1080/10875301.2010.532662>** is a persistent link to the article and is accessible both on- and off-campus.
4. Test all links before posting them via email, on course webpages, etc.

# OBTAINING PERSISTENT LINKS TO PERIODICAL TITLES

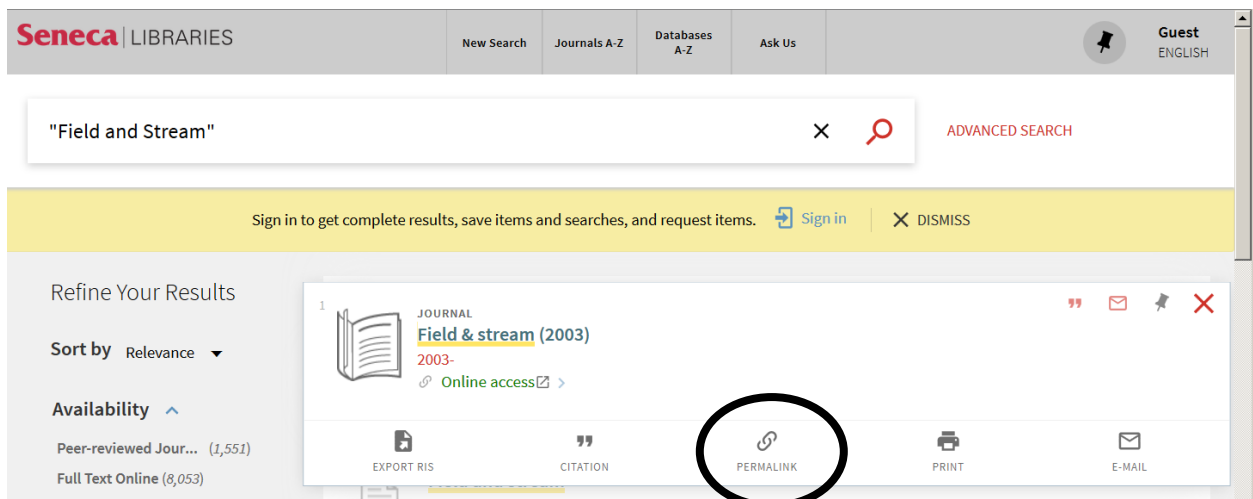
## ALL JOURNAL TITLES

Persistent links to periodical titles (journals, magazines, newspapers, etc.) are available through the search box on the [Seneca Libraries homepage](http://library.senecacollege.ca/). This type of link will allow users to view all of the libraries' holdings for specific titles.

1. Go to the Seneca Libraries homepage at <http://library.senecacollege.ca/> and search for the name of a periodical:



2. Click the three dots over to the right to reveal the following options:

3. Click “PERMALINK” to reveal this:
